# **Impact through Action**

The Yuba-Sutter Farm Bureau is dedicated to advocating for the farmers and ranchers who feed our communities. Members and staff actively represent agriculture on local, state, and national issues.

# **♦** Locally:

- Staff and board members attended County Board of Supervisors meetings when issues impacting agriculture were discussed.
- Supported the Sutter County Ag Commissioner's request to ban industrial hemp through:
  - Writing two formal letters to the Sutter County Board of Supervisors
  - Speaking at two Board of Supervisors meetings
  - Sending a special edition e-newsletter to members about the ban
  - Meeting individually with Supervisors to share YSFB's position.
- Endorsed local candidates for the County Board of Supervisors. Candidates were invited to board meetings to share their goals.
- Attended Congressman LaMalfa's Community Coffee event.
- Participated in the Sutter-Yuba UCCE Technical Assistance Program networking event.







# Statewide and Nationally:

- YSFB had three delegates and two alternates at the CAFB Annual Meeting who participated in state-wide policy discussions.
- Four members participated in the Commodity Advisory Committee Meetings: one as the chair, one as the vice chair, and two as members at large.
- One member served on the Policy Review Committee.
- Three members and one staff member attended the Calling on the Capitol event to discuss issues with elected officials.
- One member participated in the California Leadership Farm Bureau Program.
- Met monthly with staff from Congressman LaMalfa's office.
- · Met with staff from Senator Dahle's office.
- Attended Congressman LaMalfa's fundraiser.
- Hosted a tour for California Farm Bureau and Nationwide representatives.

# Impact through Action

# **Sutter County Ag Tours**

This year, Yuba-Sutter Farm Bureau hosted an Ag Tour for elected officials and community partners in Sutter County. There were 24 attendees, including representatives from Senator Schiff's office, Senator Dahle's office, Congressman LaMalfa's office, and the Sutter County Board of Supervisors.

We spent the day visiting members and learning about issues impacting the community. Thank you, Filter Farms, LOMO Cold Storage, and Sutter Buttes Management for hosting our group.

# Farm PAC Dirt & Chops Fundraiser

Yuba-Sutter Farm Bureau sponsored the annual Dirt & Chops Fundraiser in support of the California Farm Bureau Fund to Protect the Family Farm (FARM PAC). The event brought together members and supporters to strengthen advocacy efforts that protect agriculture across the state. Farm PAC gives Farm Bureau the ability to support candidates and causes that align with our policy goals.

# Contribution to the Kings County Farm Bureau

The Yuba-Sutter Farm Bureau made a \$10,000 contribution to Kings County Farm Bureau to support their lawsuit against the State Water Board because this lawsuit impacts every agricultural region in California, not just one county. The challenge against the State Water Board and the current implementation of the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act is critical to defending locally led groundwater management and protecting the long-term viability of agriculture.

# Young Farmers & Ranchers

Young Farmers & Ranchers is a committee of the Farm Bureau for people involved in agriculture ages 18-35. The group provides networking opportunities through monthly meetings and social events.



In 2025, the group toured four local operations highlighting rice production, aerial application, and meat processing. These visits gave members the opportunity to engage with industry leaders and expand their agricultural knowledge and skills.

Members also participated in Farm Day, teaching local youth about crops grown in the area. During months without tours, socials such as a river float and holiday party helped members strengthen connections within the group.

They expanded their Toys for Tots Drive by challenging the YSFB Board of Directors to collect more toys.

Together the group donated more than 500 toys for local families in need. YF&R won the challenge!














# **Fund for Ag Education**

The Fund for Ag Education is dedicated to supporting agricultural growth in our community. This year, F.A.E. provided scholarships, gave FFA members the chance to earn their blue jackets, and offered affordable safety and training workshops.

#### **Blue Jacket Bonanza**

The Blue Jacket Bonanza program was developed to provide FFA students in Yuba and Sutter counties who demonstrate a passion for FFA, and provide examples of how the students have earned the privilege to receive a jacket from this Program, a chance to earn their own blue jacket. This year, we awarded 25 jackets to students.

# **Irrigated Lands Regulatory Programs**

In 2003, the Irrigated Lands Regulatory Program (ILRP) was formed to regulate the discharge from irrigated agriculture for surface and groundwater to protect water quality. The Regional Water Quality Control Board is the regulator of the program.

Growers and landowners formed Coalitions to share the cost to comply and have assistance. The Coalitions report to Regional Water Quality Control Board.

The subwatershed groups were developed to support members, by region, comply with the ILRP. There are 11 subwatershed groups. These groups report to the Coalitions.

The Butte-Yuba-Sutter Water Quality Coalition (BYSWQC) and the Placer-Nevada-South Sutter-North Sacramento Subwatershed Group (PNSSNS) are individual subwatershed groups within the Sacramento Valley Water Quality Coalition.

#### Services to our members include:

- Reporting assistance for more than 1700 growers.
- Provided regulatory updates and clarification to members via email communications and one on one interactions.
- Coordinated educational opportunities including presentations at local grower meetings and training videos available on YouTube.
- Addressed pesticide exceedances that are harmful to water quality by working with growers, ag commissioners, and Sacramento Valley Water Quality Coalition.





# NOW + CARPOPHILUS BEETLE = MORE REASONS TO MUMMY SHAKE



Mummy sanitation has proven effective for controlling NOW in almond orchards, and early research suggests it also works against carpophilus beetle.
