Instructions

Thank you for signing your students up for Farm Day! Nearly 2,000 students will be in attendance and there will be over 40 partners who have volunteered to help educate your students about agriculture. We plan to provide a FUN and EDUCATIONAL experience!

Backpack and Nametag Delivery:

Participating students will receive a **Farm Day backpack** when they arrive.

Teachers will receive a presenter list and map, plus a teacher bag with ag information included upon check-in. We are not providing name tags this year.

FARM DAY FORMAT

Farm Day will be open from **8:30 am-12:00 pm**. Your class can come anytime and stay as long as you want within that period.

ALL schools will park at the **North** entrance, off of C Street (behind Gauche Aquatic Park). All buses and cars will park in the same parking lot, **CARS TO THE RIGHT AND BUSES TO THE LEFT. DO NOT UNLOAD YOUR STUDENTS UNTIL THE BUS IS PARKED.**

Upon arrival, a volunteer will meet you at the entrance. Look for the sign that says, "CHECK IN". Teachers will receive a teacher bag and student backpacks. Snacks will be available at snack tables throughout the fairgrounds. The snacks donated are fruit cups, prunes, and almonds. We will also offer additional resources, and maps at the resource table near check-in.

PHOTO BOOTH:

At any time during your visit, please stop by the Photo Booth to have your class photo taken. Please be courteous if several classes are waiting for their turn. The **Free Time Area** is available for you to wait with your class, stop and have a snack, or just take a break.

INFORMATION & FIRST AID BOOTH:

An information booth will be located at check-in. If you have any questions throughout the day, please stop by for assistance. Lost children will be located here. We will also have a first aid kit available for those who may need it at this booth.

HAND WASHING STATIONS:

Three portable hand washing stations are available for your use. Please also use your established hygiene procedures after leaving Farm Day and wash your hands before eating. Hand sanitizers will also be available at most presenter stations, the Photo Booth, and at two locations near the barns.

WATER STATION:

We will provide bottled water in several locations around Farm Day. Look for the blue tubs by the snack booth. Please be mindful to have students pick up all trash pieces.



SNACK STATION:

We will provide snack stations in several locations around Farm Day. There will be peaches, prunes, walnuts, and almonds available. Please be mindful to have students pick up all trash pieces.

Additional Rules

- **Please bring no more than 1 adult chaperone for every 5 students.**
- Encourage bathroom use before departure from school.
- Chaperones should arrive with your bus if possible. Chaperones should enter the fairgrounds and check in with the class they are supervising.
- Students should be dressed properly for outdoor weather. It may be cool or rainy and Farm Day is an outdoor event. We suggest a jacket or sweatshirt and close-toed shoes.
- Students should leave personal backpacks at school, and the backpacks provided by Yuba-Sutter Farm Bureau are encouraged to take home materials our presenters offer.
- Teachers are to remain with their students at all times. You are in charge of discipline for your students. There will be farm equipment, livestock, and other potential dangers. Any undisciplined class that presents a safety hazard to themselves or others will be returned to their bus.
- Please advise your students and chaperones not to pet the animals, unless otherwise mentioned by presenters.
- If a child needs to use the restroom, please have an adult chaperone accompany them.
- All presenters, guides, and other participants are volunteers. Many are taking personal time off of work and school to be there, so please be polite and patient if a delay occurs.
